### Governor Lynch, Senator Shaheen, Energy Leaders and Area Families Celebrate State's First Wind Farm at Dedication Event in Lempster

#### WHO & WHAT:

State and local elected officials will join families and businesses from Lempster and the surrounding communities to celebrate the Granite State's first utility-scale wind power project in Lempster, Sullivan County.

The Lempster Wind Power Project brings a new source of clean, renewable power to the region and will make enough electricity to power approximately 10,000 homes each year. PSNH is purchasing all of the energy from the project, and is reselling a portion of the power to the New Hampshire Electric Cooperative, the local service provider.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Lempster Wind Power Project, located in Sullivan County, New Hampshire, is the first modern, utility-scale wind farm in New Hampshire. The 12 turbines at this wind power project generate 24 megawatts (MW) of clean, renewable energy and contribute jobs and tax revenue to the local community.

**DIRECTIONS TO Lempster Wind Power Project:**

From Manchester/Concord – drive time from Concord is approximately one hour

- From 89 North, go 9 miles to Exit 5 (Rt. 202/9). Exit 5 is a left lane exit.
- After 16 miles (note that 202 splits to the right along the way, so stay on Rt. 9 West towards Keene), just past the red Corner Store and before the 1830 House Motel, turn right from Rt. 9 onto Rt. 31 North.
- Travel on Rt. 31 for 9 miles to the Town of Washington.
- In Washington, just after the Washington General Store, bear right to stay on Rt. 31.
- Continue 8.8 miles on Rt. 31, then turn left onto Rt. 10 South.
- Proceed 4.8 miles to the parking area on the right, marked by the Town of Lempster bulletin board, and across the street from the Bonnie Plant Farm Greenhouses.
- Shuttles will take you to the project from there.
